


The PGE tankers should have been shipped to you prior to the February meeting.














< Bruce and Graham appear to be appreciating a Marx Stream Line set.






CABINETS OF CURIOSITIES #1:

VIES SZALANSKI

<-- Marx 6" wall -- 1/2 of what used to be one of those "Solitude" tapes display cases (a 2-sided case ripped in half, with a couple of extra shelves to fill a gap). Looking good.</p>

The fate of most great glass display cases is here shown. Tons of Marx trains and accessories fill every inch.



The top 4 shelves feature British Marx trains of the 30's. Lovely wonderful stuff, in your editor's opinion, made by Marx for the UK market. Marx had a factory in Britain for a time.

The lower 2 shelves feature passenger and freight cars made by Hornby for the American market (the most colourful cars). Hornby had a factory in the US for a few years.
