



IN MEMORIUM — BRUCE FOWLER text by Rick Dunn, PNW TCA

Bruce Fowler, a resident of Snohomish WA, passed away on Monday the 12th of November. Bruce was a true 'gentle-man' collector and was a friend to many of us in TCA & TTOS here in the Northwest. He was a long time toy train collector and operator who was well known at many meets and shows. He was a member of TTOS, TCA, the Canadian Toy Train Association, the Northern Pacific Railroad Historical Association and other Rail Fan Groups. Although he acquired and operated three rail O gauge equipment, Bruce's true passion was for old English Hornby tin trains, even traveling to England several times to acquire rare pieces of rolling stock or structures for his Hornby Home layout. Bruce's passing closes the "passing on" of information unique to Lionel Postwar Trains and English Hornby equipment. Bruce and his smile will be missed.
