



"I was recently treated to a very interesting collection of Canadian Pacific Railway artifacts, known as "The Chung Collection". It is housed in Rare Books and Special Collections on Level 1 of UBC Library's Irving K. Barber Learning Centre. If you're interested in the history of the Canadian Pacific Railway, this is a great place to dig into some fascinating treasures and spend an hour or two. And it's free! Park in the North Parkade, close by.

It features the expected batch of railway artifacts, but also puts the CP steamship and railway operations into the context of the other themes of the exhibit: Early British Columbia History and the immigration and settlement of the Chinese population, upon whose backs much of the CPR was built.

Dr. Wallace Chung's family emigrated to Victoria from China over 100 years ago. Inspired to start collecting by an illustrated poster of the C.P. R.M.S. Empress of Asia in his father's tailor shop in Victoria, Dr. Wallace B. Chung amassed over 25,000 items over sixty years. Starting with little things clipped from newspapers and magazines for his scrapbook, Dr. Chung assembled an extensive research collection of items on early British Columbia history, immigration and settlement, particularly of Chinese people in North America, and the Canadian Pacific Railway Company.

The huge model of the 'Empress of Asia', a centerpiece of the exhibit, was meticulously restored over thousands of hours by Dr. Chung. A large 'live steam' model CP locomotive is displayed close by. Other fascinating items include official contracts, government documents, dining car menus and other handwritten letters between government and railway officials.

DR. Chung specialized in vascular surgery throughout his forty year career. He retired from the University of British Columbia in 1991 as Professor of Surgery and Head of the Department of Surgery at the UBC Hospital. His wife, Dr. Madeline Chung came to North America in 1949 and specialized in obstetrics and gynecology. For a time the only Chinese-speaking obstetrician in Vancouver, she delivered over 6,500 babies during her more than forty year career.

The complete Collection contains more than 25,000 rare and unique items, including documents, books, maps, posters, paintings, photographs, silver, glass, ceramic ware and other artifacts. (Only a portion of the items can be displayed at any time.)

Specific to the Canadian Pacific Railway: Documents, maps and publications show how the Canadian Pacific Railway was built, and how Vancouver was chosen as the western terminus. Photographs and accounts of the building of the railway are presented, along with vibrant posters promoting travel and tourism via C.P.R. rail and steamships. Beautiful examples of cruise ship memorabilia provide a glimpse of the style of the times.

I peeked into all the corners, opened all the drawers and pulled open all the sliding display panels. It's well worth a visit to the UBC Campus to explore this very unique collection.
