

### FATHER JOHN RETIRES

Father John Eason, who will turn 75 in November, retires after two decades of bringing the Gospel to sailors as Port Chaplain of the Apostleship of the Sea Ministry. Father John has been the Catholic Chaplain to the Port of Vancouver since 1997. For about 5 days every week he boarded ships docked in Vancouver to bring sailors religious comfort plus envelopes stuffed with rosaries, miraculous medals, stickers and pamphlets about mass. The Ministry also distributed Christmas gifts to the sailors. During this year alone he visited over 900 vessels.

Father John (ordained May 11, 1968) has been a priest for nearly 5 decades, whose love for the mass drew him into religious life. While Father John is retiring, he still plans to continue helping out as a volunteer to the Apostleship of the Sea Ministry. He says 'he hopes to die with his shoes on'.

With help from his friend and fellow Club member, Henry Graber, Father John had an extensive 'G' gauge layout in the Rectory of his church. With his retirement, the layout had to be dismantled, but with help from Henry the layout is being rebuilt in his new residence.
