
September 26 was also outgoing president Mark Horne's birthday, celebrated with a cake and appropriately challenging array of candles.



New board member Howie Williams has taken on the role of contacting ill members. Our 'club wellness officer' or perhaps 'the sunshine guy'? Thanks Howie!


In other news, the documents from the Sept 26 Annual General Meeting have been posted on our members' page.





