

Another fabulous picture of the time that was. A CPR passenger train meets the SS Nakusp at Robson, near present-day Castlegar. The mountain-and-valleys terrain of the Kootenays made a train and boat service the most practical system of 1890's transportation.

The Nakusp, launched in 1894 and reputed to be the finest sternwheeler in the province - with hot and cold running water, steam heat, electric lights, and chandeliers in the dining room - plied the Arrow Lakes, connecting rail end to lakeshore communities.


