



The first one hundred fifty (150) convention registrants will receive a "Las Vegas & Tonopah, Railroad" poster suitable for framing.



The poster measures 15 ³/₄ inches x 21 inches and has the LV&T route map on one side. The other side has original LV&T advertising, schedules, and a history of The Goldfield

- There will be raffles and a bid auction in the Trading Hall.
- The Welcoming Party Silent Auction will feature some great items coming out of the TTOS archives.
- The Convention Banquet will feature a silent auction during the Cocktail Hour.
- After dinner, you can expect to see some great items at the **Bid Auction**.
- As mentioned in the chip page, we are gathering as much **documentation on the gaming chips** as we can get. This material will be organized into a historical set of information on each gaming chip and auctioned.

Artwork and prototypes for the Las Vegas & Tonopah convention boxcars, the AC Gilbert milk tank car, and the transparent boxcar will be auctioned.

Gaming Chip Incentive The conditions below are not difficult to meet; they are actually pretty easy to meet. The intent is to provide an incentive for TTOS members to attend the Las Vegas – 2005 convention and to reserve rooms at the Riviera Hotel. If we meet our room night obligation, we get the trading hall and meeting space for free. If we don't meet our obligation, we have to pay for the trading hall and meeting space.
