BRITISH COLUMBIA MARKS 150TH ANNIVERSARY WITH HISTORIC TRAIN THROUGH THE PROVINCE

The CP 2816 Empress, a steam train that will lead the tour of BC in June as part of BC's 150th Anniversary celebrations. The train, including two vintage passenger coaches and a heritage baggage car converted into a rolling version of the Royal BC Museum's Free Spirit Stories of You, Me and BC exhibit;

Premier Gordon Campbell unveiled the CP Spirit of 150 Rail Tour by riding into the West Coast Express stop at Waterfront Station on the CP 2816 — the historic engine that will lead the tour.

The Empress was built in December 1950 in Montreal and is the only surviving Class Hib-Hudson type engine. More

Could it Happen Here?

Dozens injured as boy wreaks havoc by playing trains with city's trams

POLISH schoolboy who turned a city's tram network into a giant toy by manoeuvring rolling stock using a TV-style remote control has been arrested after he caused chaos on the public transport system.

Adam Dabrowski, 14, described by teachers as a model pupil and an electronics genius, hacked into the public transport network in Lodz to change the track points derailing at least four trams and leaving dozens injured.

The teenager had also equipped himself with a hand- drawn map of city tram junctions. He told police in Lodz in central Poland he had



changed the points on tram tracks across the city for a prank. But in one incident alone 12 people were injured. The giant train set started operating at 1pm on Tuesday when a city tram driver tried to steer his vehicle on to right hand tracks, and found himself helpless to prevent it swerving to the left instead, seemingly of its own accord. The rear wagon then swung off the rails and crashed into another passing tram, hurling screaming passengers to the floor.

Transport employees said they knew immediately that someone outside their staff had caused the accident. Miroslaw Micor, spokesman for Lodz police, said: "He studied the trans and the tracks for a long time and then built a device that looked like a TV remote control and used it to manoeuvre the trans and the tracks."

Mr Micor added: "He had converted the TV control into a device capable of controlling all the junctions on the line and wrote in the pages of a school exercise book the best junctions to move trams around and what signals to change. "He treated it like any other schoolboy might a giant train set – but it was lucky nobody was killed.

"Four trams were derailed, and others had to make emergency stops that left passengers hurt. He clearly did not think about the consequences of his actions." *Below Left — Snow — about a foot of the cold wet white*

GORDON HALL's Christmas Layout

TTOS Canadian Division Member, Gordon Hall, from Surrey, BC had his O Gauge trains set up at Christmas at *Canada Place* next to the *West Coast Railway Association* mini-rail operation.



ith the *Polar* E x p r e s smovie playing IN 3-D upstairs at the CN Imax Theatre I set up a Polar Express train modified to match. I added a red taillight and snow on the roofs with sparkles that twinkle as the train moves, as in the

movie. I was not thinking of getting a Polar Express set for myself but thought it most fitting for this event! I picked up the train set at a discount house, and found some extra Fastrack at *Central Hobbies*, a PE diner from *On Track Hobbies*, and the Hobo car from *John Constible* at *Trestles N' Trains*.

I set up a poster listing the local Lionel hobby shops contact info. and a stack of business cards from each which disappeared quickly. Several people asked where they could get Lionel trains and I expect there were a few sales for these vendors. A few more introduced to Lionel trains! A Lionel catalogue on the table for display had several people surprised saying they did not know that



Lionel trains were still around and several older folks mentioned having them when they were kids, and recalling having Lionel displays around the Christmas tree and in store windows.

One of my older *K-Line* engines pulled the animated Lionel freight train set that I have decorated up with Christmas decorations, including some vintage Lionel hoppers. The Lionel circus animated cars I converted to Christmas theme with a Chase gondola adding toy soldiers, and the bobbing head car adding a snow man and new stickers on both.

I added various buildings, figures and blinking lights too just to add some glitz.

As the display would be running daily for 2 weeks 10 hours a day unattended; it had to work well and be reliable. The operation was a bit different -- as folks walked up a motion detector would trip turning the power on to the layout. The power pack is a MRC HO DC setup with momentum that slowly brings the volts up in DC.

I disconnected the smoke units and reverse units AC to DC conversions in the engines and wired the motors direct to the track and connected the tender and engine pickup together for added reliable power pickup. I removed the whistle from the tender and put this near the base of the layout with a door bell button on a post for folks to blow the whistle.

A Santa with train that sings with whistle and chuffing sounds was also on the floor near front of layout. Whenever folks walked by this would start up the layout and the sounds. When folks walked away the motion detector would trip after a bit and the trains got a rest between runs.

The display ran very well for the holidays with the odd cleaning. It was a real crowd pleaser!
