THE BRIAN & WENDY KELLY STORY



"My grandfather used to take me to the station to show me trains, and as a youngster I had a lot of *Hornby* 0 gauge clockwork, which I brought with me and still have, so the train passion goes back a long way," Brian told us when asked how he got started with "the world's greatest hobby – toy trains.

Brian Kelly was born in Belfast, N. Ireland, and came to Canada at age 6.

"For my first Christmas in Canada my Dad bought me a Lionel set, then every Christmas and birthday after that was

another locomotive, another car, and the train set grew.

"As a teen I found an interest in girls and cars [not necessarily in that order] but I also began collecting trains of all makes and ages. I guess with my Irish background I still love Hornby, and British and European trains as well as North American style, so in my collection is *Hornby*, *Marklin*, *Paya*, *Basset Lowke*, *Elettren*, *Bing*, *Ferris*, *Robilt*, *Lionel*, *Marx*, *Am Flyer*, *Ives*, *Hoge*, and more. I have old trains in everything from early *Bing HO* and N right through *HO*, *OO*, *S*, *O*, *Standard*, *G*, you name it. It is a very eelectic collection.

In 1968 Brian went to work for *BC Hydro*, which later became *BC Transit*. In the 1980's Brian was the manager

Vancouver bus and Sea Bus system. That's when he met Wendy who was the mayor's confidential secretary. Later Brian moved to become a manager in Vancouver before an opportunity came to get out of the big bad city and move to *Kamloops* where he ran the bus system from 1995 until he retired earlier this year.

endy and Brian both had a love for antiques opened their own in 1997 making it a new career for Wendy until Brian retired. As there was no hobby store in Kamloops at the time and with little retail business experience they took the plunge of combining Antiques and a Hobby Store. Fortunately it worked. The business has grown over the past ten years and is now the premier train store in the BC interior, with a good customer base and a large mail order base throughout central and northern BC and beyond.

Wendy says, "We carry lots of antiques and collectibles and rent space to antique dealers, as well as trains in **Z**, **N**, **HO**, **S**, **O**, and **G**, both new and used, and of course railway books, DVD's, souvenirs,

railway antiques naturally, and *Thomas* for the kiddies."

"We have been established long enough that people will contact us to sell used trains and antiques in general, plus we keep an eye on antique shows, train shows which we always set up at, e-bay, and more," says Brian. "New items come from our various wholesalers such as Walthers, H&D, etc. As my original love is 0 gauge we are one of the only stores west of Calgary that carry a large selection of S and O gauge by makers such as *Lionel, MTH, Weaver, Williams, S Helper, American Models*, and so forth. Like our other scales most of what we stock are Canadian road names but we do special order any railway a customer wants."

Family wise Brian & Wendy have two sons in Vancouver and

two grandchildren. Their daughter is now attending university.

Brian says his "other passion", formed by a love of trains, antiques, history, and transit is the history of streetcars and interurbans in BC, mainly the BC Electric Railway. One of my roles at transit was company historian, and I have a large collection of early BCE photos, tickets, artifacts, models, and more. For the 100th anniversary of transit in BC I wrote a book on transit history, and another retirement project is to expand that book into a much larger fully detailed history of the BC Electric systems," says Brian with enthusiasm.

A member of *TCA*, *TTOS*, the *Kamloops Model Railway Club*, and a director of the *Kamloops Heritage Railway*, which operates the steam loco #2141 on excursions, Brian is obviously into real trains as well as toys.




