The train can be ready by 2006. The train's leaky tubes and flues will be replaced, her firebox replaced and she'll be building up a good head of steam.

So far the association has raised \$170,000. That's enough to start work on the restoration in February or March.





December is always party time at the TTOS Canadian Division. The season seems to bring out good will in everyone...


