MEMBER PROFILE



ill Stephenson, TTOS Canadian Division Member from Sooke, BC has been avidly collecting toy trains and train related memorabilia since the mid-seventies.

Although, like many of us, he had a toy train set — a gift from his father, when he was about eight, it had long since disappeared when he happened upon some toy trains at a garage sale.

He joined the TTOS in 1979 and while he won't put a value on his collection, he admits to having 60 engines, more than 250 feet of track and a wide assortment of model engines, cars and all kinds of miniature structures in his little train shack out back.

Many antique toy collectors have been frustrated with the challenges of making repairs to bring their models back to full functioning order. This is not a problem for Bill, who is an expert mechanic, and has the tools to work on the toys so many of us played with as children. Fortunately for the rest of us, he also repairs items from other peoples' collections restoring them with exquisite attention to detail.

Bill is a Canwest Mall regular and sets up a festive toy train annually for the Holiday Trade. There is a great deal of satisfaction in this day of electronic wizardry to see the look of wonder and amazement in the eyes of young children as they hear the clickety clack of the railway tracks and watch the old toy trains in action. Often it is the reflective look in the eyes of the parents as they too recall a simpler time and possibly their own toy trains that makes it worth all the time it takes to set up and operate.

On May 29th, 2005 Bill Stephenson was featured in the weekend edition of the Times Colonist, a Victoria, BC newspaper.

Of course they talked about his days as a Sooke Volunteer Firefighter as well as his toy train hobby. With 57 years of service, Bill is quite possibly BC's longest—serving Fireman.


