


Iced cupcakes for all!

The yellow one is a great match for CTTA's recent MTH BC Hydro Diesel. Gordon tells us the blue one is still seen in the valley.




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Ralph Spielman shared a post.

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The EEL LINE: a Canadian toy train story by Charles Reif



The EEL LINE electric train was manufactured in Montreal by Efficient Enterprises Ltd (EEL) probably in the 1950's. A set with its set box top is illustrated below. The engine is a cast aluminum diesel body with a 2-rail AC motor running on 7-15 volts, with a reverse switch on top. There are three freight cars (hopper, tank and log car) which in appearance are reminiscent of Marx's 6" lithographed freight cars, except that the EEL LINE cars appear to be silkscreened or stamped.



The train was advertised to run either on transformer or battery. An EEL LINE transformer is shown. The track has one insulated rail, and the locomotive two flanged brass wheels, one on each side, to transmit the current, two flanged plastic wheels and four unflanged plastic wheels that do not touch the rails.



Locomotives have either one side window or two, and a maple leaf rondel on the front. The red finish is 'crackle' textured on all models seen to date. The hopper car sports "CANADA COAL" on either side of another maple leaf rondel. The "SHELL" tank car has a painted wooden dowel tank with a plastic dome. A later version may have had a plastic tank.



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Two sizes of motor have been found. On the left and centre, a smaller magnet and windings with brass strip brushes; on the right, a larger magnet and windings with brush-holders. The base for motor and wheel frame attachment appears to be fibreboard, which tends to curl. Four screws attach the base to the aluminum body, which provides some rigidity.



The truck frames are rigidly attached to the base. Power is transferred from a worm gear to a bass gear on one axle. As the worm gears are steel and the tolerances large, the brass gears are often quite chewed up. (see especially left above).



Until recently the author believed all EEL LINE locomotives were 2 rail. Then the version on the left turned up. All wheels are metal, and the truck frames have a stepped shape to hold the insulated plate below the pickup. They appear to have been manufactured for this purpose. (the worm, wheels, axle and axle gear were missing, but the author was able to find replacements).



And so, as well as having several 2-rail locomotives in various states, the author finds himself with the only three-rail EEL LINE locomotive he's heard of.

Was this the result of a late effort by Efficient Enterprises Ltd. to increase sales by making their train sets compatible with Marx and other 3-rail products? Has anyone seen another of these versions of the loco?

In any case, the EEL LINE set may well be the only electric train to run on rails ever designed and made by a Canadian Company.

I exclude Marx Canada of Toronto, who were a subsidiary of the US company, until I have information that their shorty plastic-bodied steam train sets were actually designed and manufactured in Canada.
